



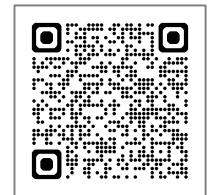

### About the course

This qualification is for individuals who want to work within an outdoor recreation industry. You'll learn practical skills in areas such as group leadership, climbing, archery, Abseiling, bushwalking, climbing, program planning, risk analysis, provision of great customer service.

### Who should enrol

This course is designed for people who are interested in working as a guide in the Outdoor Education and Recreation industry and want to explore further training in this field.

### Learning outcomes

On successful completion of this course, you will have the skills and technical knowledge to work within the controlled environments of adventure tourism, expeditions, holiday and school camps; leading groups in outdoor adventure activities, provide challenging experiences and facilitate experiential learning, according to the units delivered.

## Attendance, study load and student support

You will be required to:

- Attend all scheduled face to face sessions (including simulated activities). Sessions will run for 8 hours, two days per week, for 23 weeks.
- Undertake self-directed learning (approximately 1 day per week), including individual research. Details and expectations on these activities will be provided in your individual training plan.
- Undertake and complete theory and practical assessment activities (approximately 7-10 hours per unit of competency).
- Student support is available prior to and at the end of each session. Scheduled support sessions will also be available.

## Work experience/placement

- Complete evidence in student logbook of minimum 80 hours of work experience in relation to your training program at The Tops workplace.
- Your Trainer/Assessor will undertake skills and observation assessments in the workplace – throughout your training program. If work experience/placement is undertaken at The Tops Conference Centre, your placement will be monitored and supervised by your trainer.
- Should work experience/placement be undertaken elsewhere- at an approved outdoor recreation organisation other than The Tops- the trainer/assessor will organise consistent visits and supervision updates throughout your work placement.
- Your course schedule/timetable will provide additional information about work placement visits, observations and assessments to be conducted by your Trainer/Assessor during your work placement.

## Assessment

Assessment will include a range of activities including demonstrating skills, leading groups of participants in outdoor activities, role plays and simulations, written tasks, oral questions, and observation in the workplace.

## Smart and Skilled Government Funding

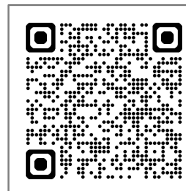

## Entry requirements

Wesley Vocational Institute has set the following entry requirements for enrolment in this course:

- Satisfactory level of language, literacy and numeracy
- Ability to commit to attendance and study load requirements for this course
- Suitable computer and internet access
- Be an Australian or New Zealand citizen or Australian Permanent Resident
- Students will need to complete HLTAID011 Provide First Aid as part of this course. If HLTAID011 is already held, a Statement of Attainment needs to be provided before the start of the training program commencement. Otherwise HLTAID011 will be offered by Wesley Vocational Institute within the training period.
